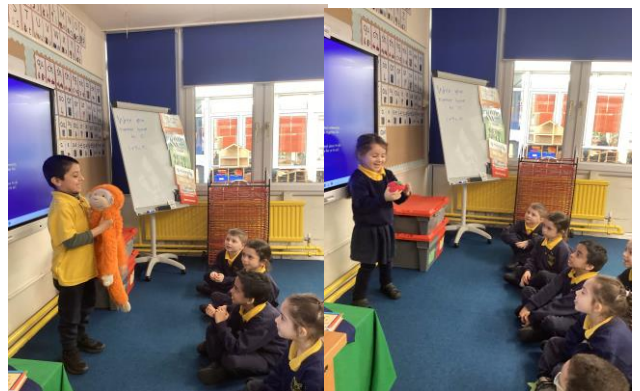
Fantastic Footballers
