JOB DESCRIPTION - CLASS TEACHER

Main purpose

The teacher will:

- Fulfil the professional responsibilities of a teacher, as set out in the School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document
- Meet the expectations set out in the Teachers' Standards

Duties and responsibilities

Safeguarding and wellbeing

- The teacher will be required to safeguard and promote the welfare of children and young people, and follow school policies, the school's Christian ethos and values and the staff code of conduct.

Teaching

- Plan and teach well-structured lessons to assigned classes, following the school's plans, curriculum and schemes of work
- Assess, monitor, record and report on the learning needs, progress and achievements of assigned pupils, making accurate and productive use of assessment
- Adapt teaching to respond to the strengths and needs of pupils
- Set high expectations which inspire, motivate and challenge pupils
- Manage pupils and the classroom environment to promote excellent behaviour for learning.
- Promote good progress and outcomes by pupils
- Demonstrate good subject and curriculum knowledge
- Ensure the inclusion and equal opportunities of all pupils

Whole-school organisation, strategy and development

- Contribute to the development, implementation and evaluation of the school's policies, practices and procedures, so as to support the school's values and vision
- Make a positive contribution to the wider life and ethos of the school
- Attend relevant INSET and external training.

Communication

- Communicate effectively and positively with pupils, the Christ Church Team and Parents and Carers

Working with colleagues and other relevant professionals

- Collaborate and work with colleagues and other relevant professionals within and beyond the school
- Develop effective professional relationships with colleagues
- Follow the Staff Team Guidelines

Personal and professional conduct

- Uphold public trust in the profession and maintain high standards of ethics and behaviour, within and outside school
- Have proper and professional regard for the ethos, policies and practices of the school, and maintain high standards of attendance and punctuality
- Understand and act within the statutory frameworks setting out their professional duties and responsibilities

Management of staff and resources

- Direct and supervise support staff assigned to them, and where appropriate, other teacher
