Yahya's presentation




The earliest human shelters were natural caves or rock shelters. People also made huts and shelters from wooden frames, or frames made from animal bones. Huts were made with reeds, mud and turf. A hearth was always central to their home for warmth and cooking.

In the stone age, people ate varied diet of hunted meat, fish, and wild foods like berries, fruits, nuts, and plants. Early Stone Age people were hunter-gatherers, while later Stone Age people learned to farm grains and raise animals. Woolly mammoths, deers and horses were usually hunted.



In the stone age era, there were giant animals like the Woolly mammoth and the sloth. There was also predators Like the saber-toothed cat and the cave lion. There were also hyenas, Wolves, deer, hippos, bison, and horses which still exists today.

Cave paintings are some of the oldest art in the world, created by people thousands of years ago. Cave paintings are drawings created using a cave wall as a canvas.
