This morning, we enjoyed a lovely sharing assembly, in which the children presented the work they have produced and the knowledge and skills they have gained on the topic. Here is a small selection of that:

Satoshi Tajiri

Satoshi Tajiri was born on the 28th of August 1965, and is 60 years old. He went to the college National Institute of Technology Tokyo College. He is a famous not growing Pokemon. Satoshi Tajiri is on the autism spectrum. He was inspired by wild life insects and he spent his time exploring parks on the road. He was Dr. Pugh.




Kindness Wheel

What a great night we had in Somers Town on Tuesday, where the girls' and boys' football teams both made a strong start to their 25/26 campaign!



