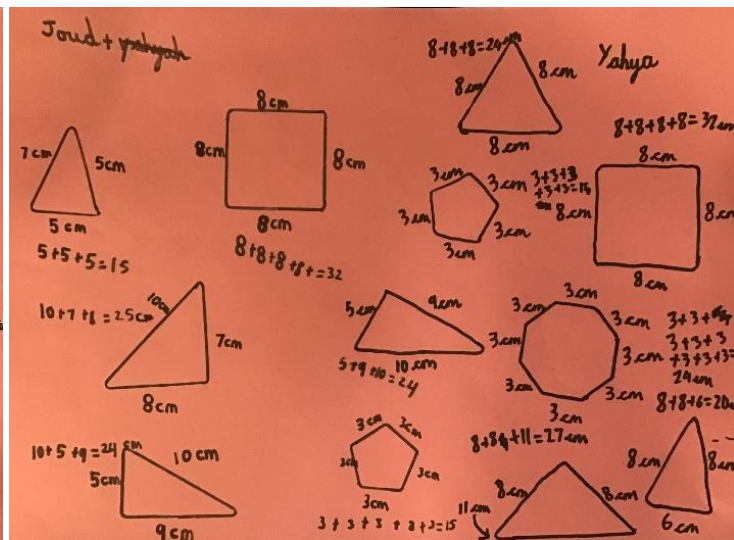
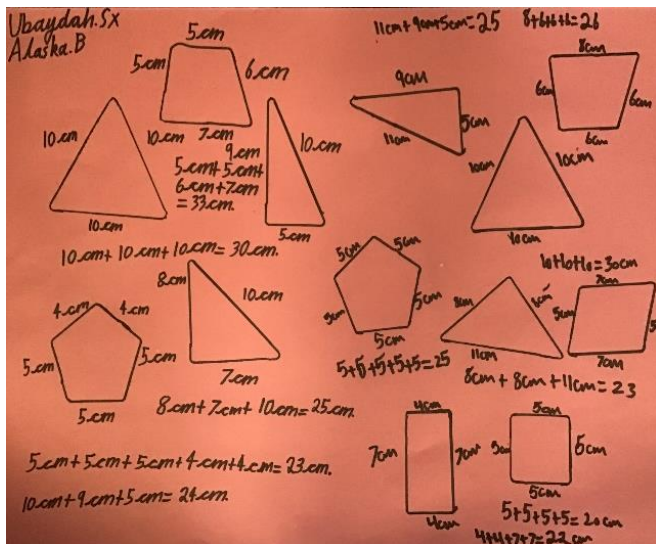
## Learning in Linden Class
