Online Safety Tip of the Week

Online Gaming and Roblox

Many children enjoy playing online games such as Roblox to socialise, create and play with others. While these games can be fun and creative, it is important for parents to stay involved and aware of who their child may be interacting with online.

Take time to explore the game with your child and check the privacy, chat and parental control settings together. Remind children never to share personal information such as their full name, school, address or passwords with other players online.

Encourage your child to only play age-appropriate games and to speak to you if anything online makes them feel uncomfortable, worried or upset. Keeping devices in shared family spaces and having regular conversations about online gaming can help children enjoy games safely and responsibly.
