Online Safety Tip of the Week: Staying Safe on Roblox

Roblox is a popular online platform where children can play games, create worlds and interact with other players. While it can be fun and creative, it is important that parents know how their child is using Roblox and who they may be communicating with online.

Talk to your child about the games they are playing and remind them that they should not share personal information, such as their full name, school, address, passwords or photos. Encourage them to only communicate with people they know in real life and to tell a trusted adult if someone says something unkind, asks personal questions or makes them feel uncomfortable.

It is also useful to check the parental controls and privacy settings on your child's Roblox account. These can help manage who can contact your child, what content they can access and how much time they spend playing. Setting clear screen time expectations, keeping devices in shared family spaces and having regular conversations can help children enjoy Roblox safely and responsibly.

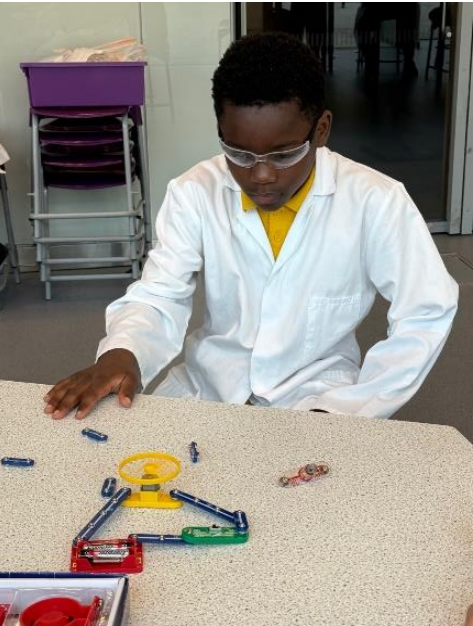

Learning in Willow Class

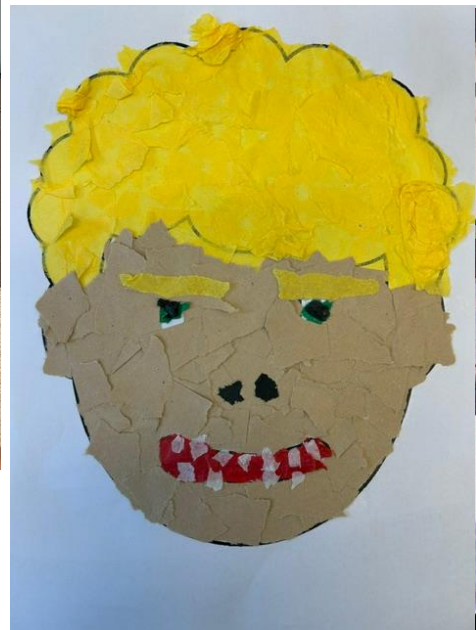
