## Online Safety Tip of the Week

### **Online Safety Tip of the Week: JusTalk Kids**

We are aware that some children may be using JusTalk Kids, a messaging and video-calling app designed for children to communicate with family and friends.

If you allow your child to use JusTalk Kids, please remember to check the suggested age rating and make sure you are monitoring how your child is using the app. Children should only communicate with people they know in real life, such as trusted family members and close friends.

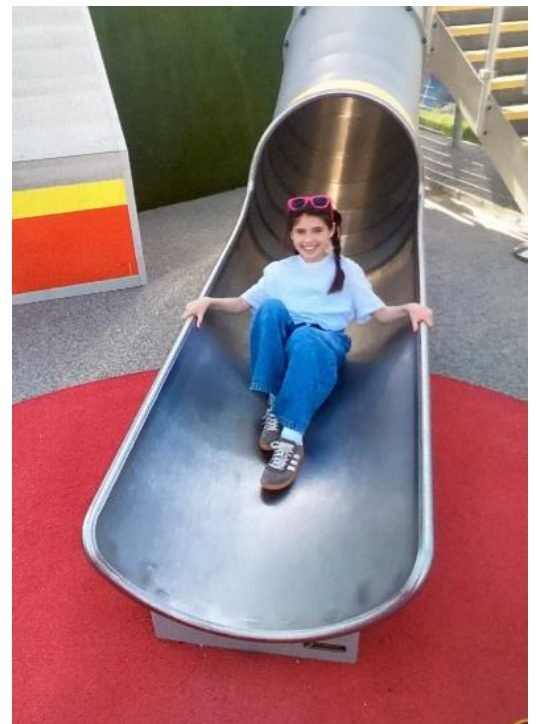
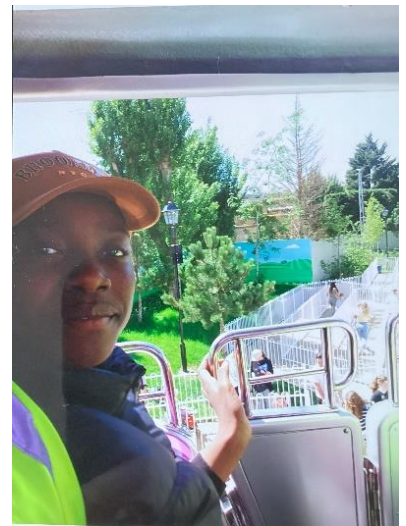
It is important to regularly check your child's contacts, privacy settings and app permissions. Remind your child not to share personal information online, including their school, address, phone number, photos, passwords or location.

Please also talk to your child about what to do if something feels wrong. They should tell a trusted adult straight away if someone says something unkind, asks personal questions, tries to add them when they do not know them, or makes them feel worried, upset or uncomfortable.

Regular conversations, clear rules about who children can contact, and keeping devices in shared family spaces can help children use messaging and video-calling apps safely and responsibly.

### Learning in Oak Class

Oak Class have worked incredibly hard throughout their SATs and should be very proud of their dedication, resilience and positive attitude. To celebrate the end of this important milestone, they enjoyed a fantastic trip to Chessington World of Adventures, where they had great fun experiencing the rides, attractions and spending time together with friends. 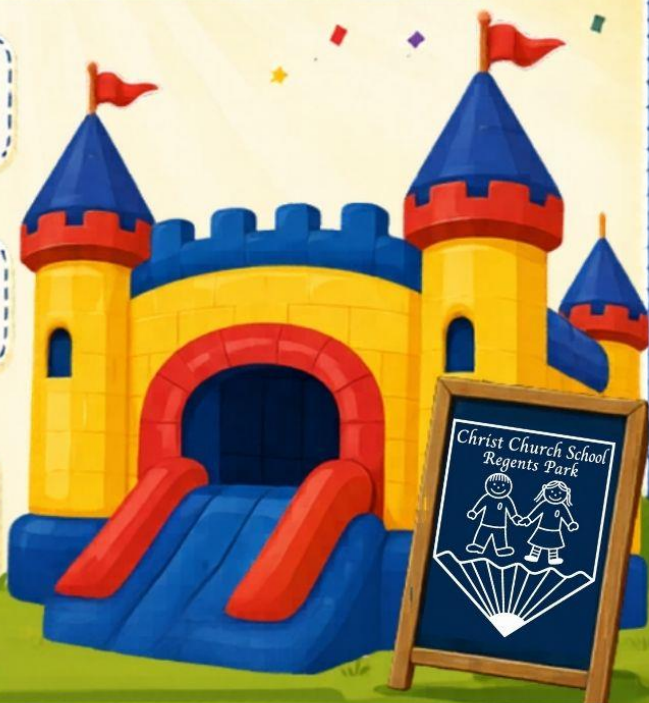
