Online Safety Tip of the Week

Online Safety Tip of the Week: YouTube and YouTube Kids

YouTube and YouTube Kids can provide children with access to educational, creative and entertaining content. However, it is important to remember that not all videos may be suitable for every child, and content can sometimes appear that is unexpected or inappropriate.

Take time to explore the platform with your child and make use of the available parental controls, including content settings, restricted modes and supervised accounts where appropriate. Regularly checking viewing history and discussing the videos your child enjoys can help you understand their online interests and experiences.

It is also important to talk to your child about being critical of what they see online. Encourage them to ask questions, think carefully about whether information is accurate, and speak to a trusted adult if they see anything that worries, confuses or upsets them.

Regular conversations about online safety, setting clear expectations around video sharing platforms, and taking an active interest in your child's online activities can help them use YouTube and YouTube Kids safely and responsibly.

Learning in Holly Class

Holly Class have been very busy using their creative skills this week. In Expressive Arts and Design, the children worked hard to create a beautiful garden display for our classroom. This art lesson focused on cutting skills and safe tool use, with the children showing great control as they used scissors to cut out flowers, leaves, grass and a shining sun. They then combined all of their work to create one big class picture, which is now brightening up our wall beautifully.

In RE, Holly Class enjoyed making special hats following a lovely nursery visit from Rue. Rue came to talk to the children about hijabs, gently explaining what they are and why some Muslim women choose to wear them. The children listened beautifully and then enjoyed using their creative skills to design and decorate their own unique hats.



The children had a fantastic time following guided instructions to make paper plate ladybirds. This lesson focused on construction and building for a purpose, with the children working step-by-step to assemble their pieces carefully. They explored how to connect plates and loose parts together, showing great problem-solving skills as they adapted their designs to make sure their ladybird structures could stand up and hold together.



in Maths, we have been learning about patterns. We explored AB patterns and identified them in different ways. The children then created their own AB patterns by threading coloured cotton reels onto laces, carefully repeating two colours in sequence. It was a fun, hands-on activity that helped develop both pattern knowledge and fine motor control.
