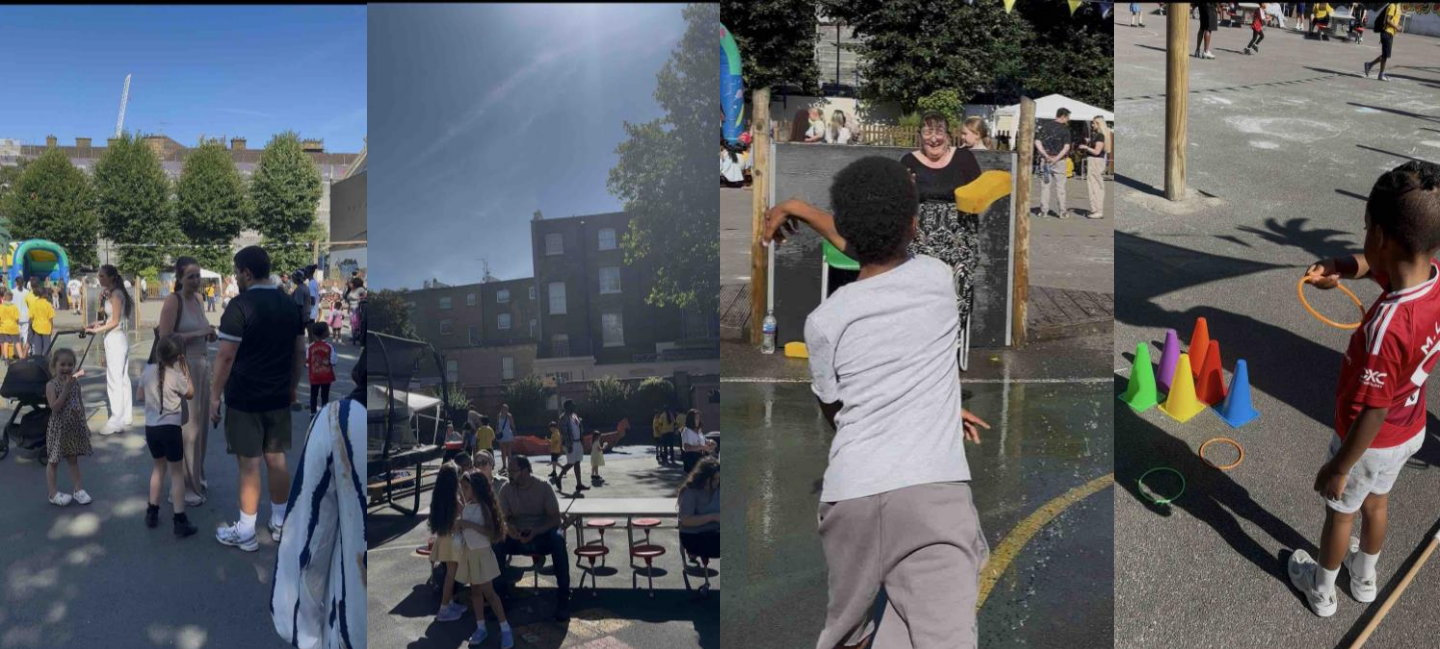

## Online Safety Tip of the Week

### **Online Safety Tip of the Week: Scams and Sharing Information**

Scams can appear in different ways, such as fake competitions, messages saying they have won a prize, links offering free game items or coins, or people pretending to be someone they are not. Children may not always recognise when something online is unsafe, especially if it looks exciting, urgent or comes from an account that seems familiar.

Talk to your child about the importance of keeping personal information private. This includes their full name, address, school, date of birth, passwords, photos, phone numbers and any information about family members. Remind them that they should never share passwords or personal details online, even with friends.

Encourage your child to pause and think before clicking links, opening messages or accepting offers online. A helpful rule is: **if something seems too good to be true, it probably is.** Children should always check with a trusted adult before entering details, downloading anything or responding to messages from people they do not know.

## Uniform

The school has recently reviewed the school uniform policy with the Governing Board with the view to seeking ways to reduce cost where possible.

The school has decided to 'phase out' the PE T-Shirts with a school logo so from September, pupils will be permitted to wear a plain yellow T-shirt for PE. This means that there are now only two branded items- the yellow polo shirt and the school sweatshirt. The school is also researching alternative providers in case they could be available more cheaply.



In the meantime, the school office usually has some limited stocks of new or nearly new items for purchase.

If you have any uniform that you no longer need and that is in a good condition, please bring it to the office so that it can be used by another child.

In Literacy, we have enjoyed reading and retelling a range of dinosaur stories, using our ideas to talk about characters, settings and what happened in the stories.
