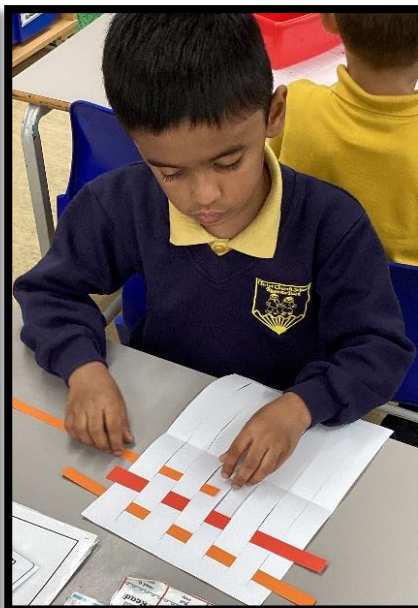
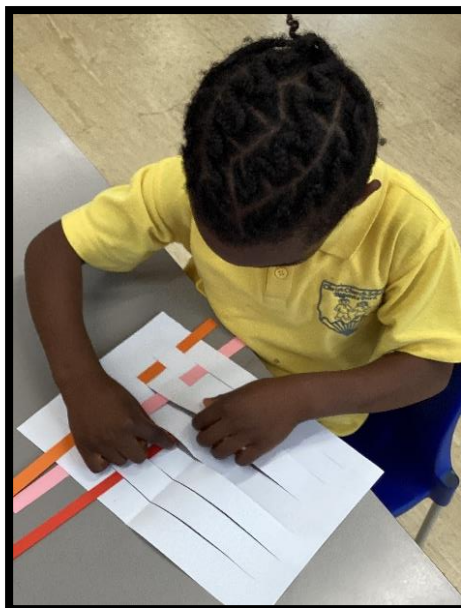


Learning in Sycamore Class

Online Safety Tip of the Week

Online Safety Tip of the Week: SMART Rules

The SMART rules are a simple way to help children remember how to stay safe online. They remind children to think carefully about what they share, who they talk to, and what they do if something online makes them feel worried or unsure.

SMART stands for: **Safe, Meet, Accept, Reliable and Tell**. Children should keep personal information safe, never agree to meet someone they have only spoken to online, be careful when accepting messages or links, remember that not everything they see online is reliable, and always tell a trusted adult if something makes them feel uncomfortable.

Talk to your child about the SMART rules and what each one means. You could ask them what they would do if someone online asked for their name, sent them a link, or said something that upset them. Regular conversations like this help children build confidence in making safe choices online and remind them that they can always come to an adult for help.
