- encourage you to feel part of the school and do our best to make you and your family feel welcome
- commit to working in partnership with parents in the best interest of your child/ren
- have a zero-tolerance approach to all forms of discrimination related to the protected characteristics as defined in the Equalities Act 2010
- communicate with you regularly, in line with school values, to ensure you remain updated with all key information

### As a parent, you will:

- ensure that your child attends school everyday possible, during term time
- ensure that your child arrives at school on time, each day
- adhere to the school's uniform policy, including footwear, supporting your child to present themselves with confidence and pride
- support our school's vision and values in order to support your child's learning
- commit to working in partnership with the school in the best interest of your child/ren, including attending events that celebrate successes and achievements
- adhere to the school's expectations related to equality of opportunity for all persons
- work with the school to ensure your child has the very best learning behaviours, including the work they produce
- keep the school informed of any changes which may affect your child's ability to perform to their very best
- help with home learning where you can, and make sure it is handed in on time
- meet with teachers when necessary to discuss progress and anything else that may arise during the year
- speak to your child's class teacher, in the first instance
- communicate in line with school values (avoiding the use of AI), with the aim to seek positive and swift resolution
- help your child understand his/her responsibilities to other people and to society
- make regular voluntary contributions to the Governors Maintenance Scheme (£15 per year)

Pupils also have responsibilities and they are expected to:

- respect and value one another, treating others as they would like to be treated
- take care of our school community and equipment
- come to school ready to learn, try their best and display positive learning behaviours (Class Charter/Golden Rules/Values)
- wear the correct school uniform with confidence and pride
- complete home learning on time, to support their learning
- speak to a safe adult if they are concerned or worried about anything which makes them anxious or upset
- understand their responsibilities to other people and our wider community

### Attendance for Nursery Children

Children under the age of five are not legally required to attend school. However, when parents and carers accept a place at our school, they are making a commitment to support their child's learning and development by ensuring they attend regularly.

Regular attendance helps children build friendships, develop routines, and make good progress in their learning. For this reason, we have the same high expectations for attendance for Nursery children as we do for children of compulsory school age.

**Please note that if your child's attendance falls below 80%,** and there are no exceptional circumstances, the school may review and withdraw their place in our Nursery provision.
